WHAT IS A RECOVERY COURT?

- Recovery Courts (also called Treatment Courts &/or Problem-Solving Courts) are a form of judicial supervision for individuals dealing with significant mental health and/or substance abuse issues.
- Tennessee's 82 recovery courts are judicially-supervised court dockets that reduce correctional costs, protect community safety, and improve public welfare. In recovery courts, non-violent individuals with substance use disorders participate in treatment while under close legal and clinical supervision.
- While each jurisdiction sets a "Scope of Practice" traditionally these courts serve high risk/ high need offenders who voluntarily enter the program.
- ▶ This is not a "get out of jail free card."
- All programs are VOLUNTARY, but the ADA, defense counsel, & judge must agree to send the cases to the Recovery Court.





Must be able to provide DD214

• Type of Discharge is irrelevant

2 Tracks in this program:

- High Risk/ High Need: 18 months, 5 Phases
- Moderate Risk/ Moderate Need: 12 months, 4 Phases

Partner with the VA to ensure continuum of care

Judge Trey McFarlin presides over the weekly docket




Historically called "Drug Court" and still referred as that commonly in Murfreesboro.

Must have primary substance abuse issue but accepts co-occurring disorders.

High Risk/ High Need

18-month program, 5 Phases

Judge Jimmy Turner presides over weekly dockets



Eligible applicants are those with a severe & persistent mental illness.

May be co-occurring

TBI, Autism Spectrum Disorder and Intellectual Disabilities are not accepted unless it is secondary to a mental illness.

High Risk/ High Need

18-month program, 5 Phases

Judge Barry Tidwell presides over the weekly dockets

HOW DO THESE PROGRAMS IMPACT THE COMMUNITY?

- Mental Health Court has a recidivism rate of 11%
 - Drug Court has a recidivism rate of 6%
- Veteran's Treatment Court has a recidivism rate of 2%
 - DUI Court has a recidivism rate of 2%
- Compared to a recidivism rate of 47% for the State of Tennessee




- > NON-VIOLENT OFFENDER

WHO WE SERVE

- CHARGES INVOLVING HOMICIDE, USE OF FIREARM, ARSON, &/OR SEXUAL OFFENSES
- > THOSE LIVING OUTSIDE OF THE 16TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT
 - > THOSE WITH HOLDS AND/OR ACTIVE WARRANTS IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS
 - CANNOT WORK AS A CRIMINAL INFORMANT WHILE IN THE PROGRAM

Groups that are modeled on Evidence Based Practices

Referrals to Community Based Services (inpotient/ residential treatment, mental health treatment, physical health needs, etc)

HOW TO APPLY

SELF REFERRAL

- ON THE KIOSK AT RCADC
- FAMILY REFERRAL ON BEHALF OF THE APPLICANT
- WALK INTO THE OFFICE
- APPLY ONLINE

COURT REFERRAL

- DEFENSE COUNSEL, ADA OR JUDGE CAN REQUEST AN APPLICATION BE COMPLETED
- JAIL STAFF CAN COMPLETE A REFERRAL/APPLICATION
- ARRESTING OFFICER CAN RECOMMEND TO THE COURTS

COMMUNITY REFERRAL

 MENTAL HEALTH CASE MANAGER, SOCIAL WORKER, DCS, ETC. CAN INITIATE THE REFERRAL AND REQUEST APPLICATION.



- THE RE-ENTRY TEAM ENTERS THE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES IN RUTHERFORD COUNTY AND PROVIDES CLASSES AND CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES.
- GROUPS AND CLASSES THAT ARE EVIDENCE BASED.
 - MRT
 - ANGER MANAGEMENT
 - ► RELAPSE PREVENTION
 - ► SEEKING SAFETY
 - UNTANGLING RELATIONSHIPS
- THE INCARCERATED PERSON MUST VOLUNTARY ENROLL IN THE GROUPS.
