



SB46 / HB62 Dynamic Accessibility Act

SB46 / HB62 enacts the “Dynamic Accessibility Act,” requiring the commissioner of general services to designate a new symbol of access for persons with disabilities for use on state property. This logo must depict a character leaning forward with a sense of movement, signifying equivalent facilitation and accessibility.

The word “Accessible,” must accompany the symbol when appropriate.

The Department of Revenue must also designate this new symbol of access for drivers and passengers with disabilities for use on registrations, placards, decals, and license plates.

The bill also designates that various parts of language in the Tennessee Code Annotated are to be amended to emphasize the term “symbol of access.”
